Waste Management Schedule Changes

Waste Management will be rerouting some of their residential customers and commercial businesses who have toters. Approximately 60-80% of customers will see a change in service, either day or service week (ie: which week they pick up recycling vs. greenwaste). All customers will be notified by letter; WM will also place an article in The Union. This realignment of service areas will result in an overall improvement in the consistency of service as all pickup activity will be focused in a geographic area and thus less likely to have customers experience missed pickups. Additionally, WM says that service days organized, cart pickup and delivery service will be more responsive as labor can be directed more effectively. Using Crosswalks Properly

CALIFORNIA VEHICLE
CODE 21950 STATES
THAT:

- (a) The driver of a vehicle shall yield the right-of-way to a pedestrian crossing the roadway within any marked crosswalk or within any unmarked crosswalk at an intersection, except as otherwise provided in this chapter.
- (b) This section does not relieve a pedestrian from the duty of due care for his or her safety. No pedestrian may suddenly leave a curb or other place of safety and walk or run into the path of a vehicle that is

so close as to constitute an immediate hazard. No pedestrian may unnecessarily stop or delay traffic while in a marked or unmarked crosswalk.

- (c) The driver of a vehicle approaching a pedestrian within any marked or unmarked crosswalk shall exercise all due care and shall reduce the speed of the vehicle or take any other action relating to the operation of the vehicle as necessary to safeguard the safety of the pedestrian.

- (d) Subdivision (b) does not relieve a driver of a vehicle from the duty of exercising due care for the safety of any pedestrian within any

unmarked crosswalk or within any unmarked crosswalk at an intersection. Notice these subdivisions do not necessarily require a motorist to wait for a crossing-walking pedestrian to completely leave the crosswalk and step onto the curb before a driver may lawfully pass. Instead, the statute requires only that a driver yield the right-of-way to pedestrians [subsection (a)], and to exercise "all due care," [Subsection (c)]. Vehicle Code 525 defines right-of-way as "the privilege of the immediate use of the highway."
