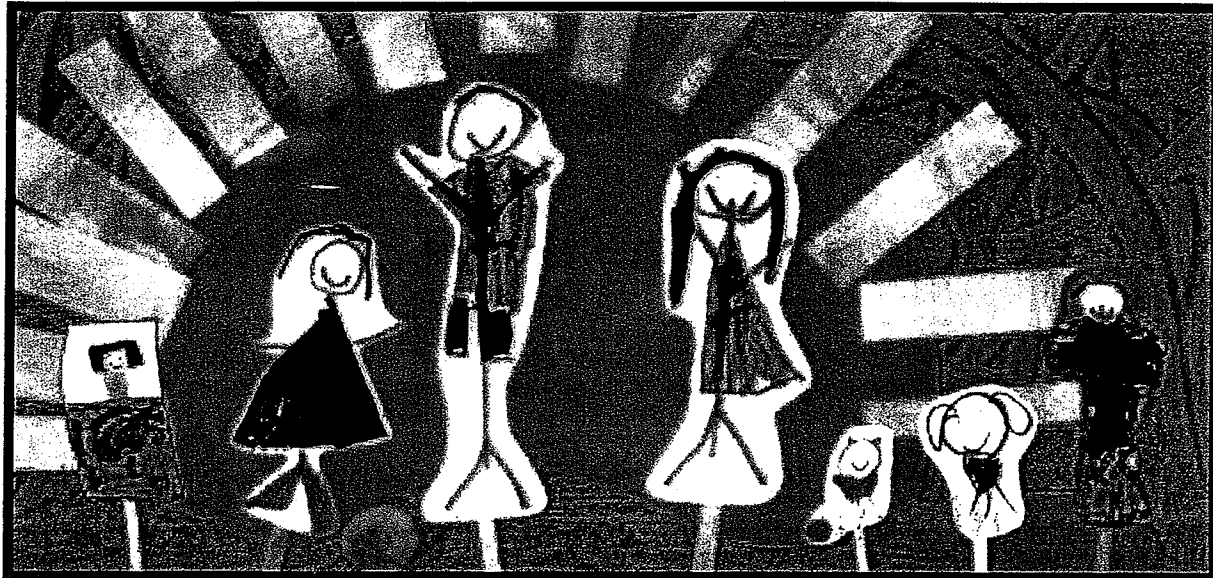

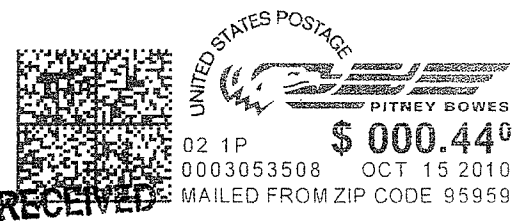

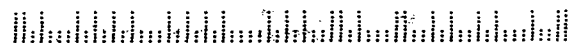

As you are considering possible best usages for the Old Alpha Hardware building, may I share a few ideas with you.

Much of our local financial well-being depends heavily upon tourism. Shops and activities which attract visitors are vital. People will come from the Sacramento and San Francisco areas to see unusual shops and galleries. They will not come to see a small group of ethnic-food stalls or a community office building

We have a number of attractive activities—MIM, Summer Nights, Christmas street celebrations, the Bike Race—but only one first-rate gallery. We also have a number of first-rate artists and artisans with few scattered places to exhibit and sell their works.

Carmel. Sausalito, Mendocino, all appeal to travelers because of their art scene. So could Nevada City. The Alpha Building has ample areas, power, an elevator, and parking space. Almost every single business, restaurant, B. and B. would profit from such a drawing card. Certainly our sales-tax receipts would increase. Another plus—the Szekelys could continue with their project..

I truly believe a proper conversion would be a win-win for our entire community. A mis-conversion would be a serious loss.

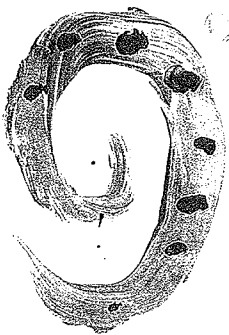


Re: **PROTEST** against the proposed water rate changes
(Utility Service Account No. 040-1270/GRE0025)

I am the owner of record of 122 Cottage St., Nevada City and I protest the raising of my water rate. I am already being grossly overcharged for my water and sewer. I am a senior citizen with a very limited income (I qualified for a USDA low income home repair loan). My home contains two bedrooms and two baths. I rent out part of this home that includes one of those bedrooms and baths—usually to one person although occasionally to a couple. For this I pay \$263 every two months—twice as much as my neighbors who have the same or far more people, bedrooms and bathrooms on their property! I use minimal water on the land itself as I have very little yard space. I have protested my being penalized unfairly and at great hardship to myself and have gotten no satisfaction. This is really outrageously unfair!

Please charge those who have more than two people and/or two bedrooms and bathrooms on their property rather than raising rates on those who are living as simply and economically as possible in order to simply survive in these hard economic times.

I also request (again) that my situation be reconsidered as I would have qualified as a renter of low-income housing to not have my rental unit charged for water-and-sewer—however, I was disqualified because I had already made sure that my grandfathered unit was legal with the city.
