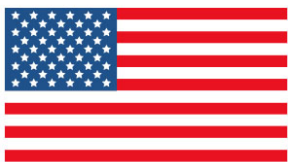

Volunteer Coordinator Needed

At the October 11th City Council meeting, a job description for a Volunteer Coordinator position was approved and City staff are now actively recruiting for this position.

This is a volunteer position that will recruit, train and organize volunteers for the City’s

projects that are made possible by the efforts of volunteers. The City has 2—6 volunteer projects each year.

Street, Sidewalk, Parking & ADA Improvements

During the next 4-6 months, City Engineering and the Public Works Department will be continuing improvements for Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) access throughout Nevada City. In accordance with Title II of the ADA code, the City provides equal opportunity to participate in and benefit from the City’s services, programs and activities. Since much of the

downtown was built in the late 1800’s with steep streets and historic buildings, this task requires innovation. The upcoming projects involve street improvements to improve sidewalk access ramps and ADA parking spaces with a path of travel to public facilities. Projects are at various locations throughout the downtown historic district and on Adams

and Nile Streets for a new sidewalk to Pioneer Park. The City is using a variety of funding sources for this work, including Community Development Block Grant (CDBG), Congestion Mitigation Air Quality (CMAQ) grant, Parking Meter fees and locally approved Measure S funds. Please be aware of potential traffic impacts while this work is occurring.

Pioneer Park Happenings

Little Deer Creek Restoration Project

The first phase of this project has been completed. Cement channels have been removed from portions of the creek and replaced with more natural river rock. The next phase of the project will take place late summer 2018. You may notice caution tape in that area. We are trying to keep people off this area, because of re-seeding. The seeds need time to germinate and grow.

The Field near the Bandshell

French drains were placed in the field surrounding the ball field and in areas by the Bandshell. Wiess Bros. then seeded the area, so this area is surrounded by caution tape as well until grass has grown.

The City is hopeful that this will provide a more playable surface for more of the year. Because of the location and how close the ground water is to the surface, it will always be wetter than other areas, but this should help.

Winter Storm Damage

Throughout the year, the City has been working with FEMA to get the park cleaned-up from winter storms and building infrastructure to avoid such damage in the future. The picnic areas were cleaned up in May, the horseshoe pins had to be replaced, the French drains in the field were completed throughout the summer. We also have plans to replace the backstop and field dirt on the lower ball field.

Help us Monitor Funds Designated for Safety Personnel

The City is currently accepting applications from interested citizens to serve as a member of the Measure C Citizens Oversight Committee.

The purpose of the Measure C Citizens Oversight Committee is to review the revenue and expenditure of funds designated for the Fire Department and one additional Police Officer. The City receives the funds from a 3/8-cent special transactions and use tax. This tax was on the November 8, 2016 ballot as Measure C.

All members of the oversight committee shall be at least 18 years of age and reside within City limits to qualify. (City limit addresses are three digit or less.)
