Be aware of what is taking place on the field, keep your dog close and pick up after your dog.

In-Town Trails

Did you know there are several trails in town that can take you near Deer Creek? Little Deer Creek trail connects

between the Stonehouse parking lot and Pioneer Park. Miner's Trail connects from Broad St. to Cabin St. and from there you can get onto Tribulation Trail which connects the Pine St. bridge to Jordan St., where you can walk to the Nisenan Section of the Deer Creek Tribute Trail System. Please notice that these trails are close to homes, so be respectful of the neighbors and keep your dogs on a leash.
