City Hires Interim City Manager

Nevada City has hired an Interim City Manager, Joan Phillippe. Joan comes to Nevada City as a retired city manager with over 35 years' experience in local government including as City Manager in Loomis, Colusa, Colfax and Clearlake as well as executive director of the California State Sheriffs' Association and Assistant City Manager in South Lake Tahoe. Since retirement she has provided interim management and consulting services. Joan's experience in small communities faced with economic and fiscal challenges

drew the council to her. Her experience with water and wastewater issues was also a benefit. She has substantial planning experience having worked on updating General Plans, zoning ordinances and other planning documents including economic development plans. In addition, her experience in working with other jurisdictions as well as state and federal government officials was seen as an asset for Nevada City. Joan has assisted several cities in the recruitment and transition of city managers by

helping to identify the qualities and assets needed in a candidate to be a good fit for an organization, its staff, and its community.

Joan is familiar with Nevada City having had family living in the area for many years. She and her husband, Brian, were also married in the city and visit it regularly. Joan's contract with the city will run until the council fills the position with a permanent City Manager. It is anticipated filling the position will take approximately six months.

Nevada City Public Works is planning to begin removal of nuisance vegetation in accordance with Municipal Code (NCCMC) 8.04.020 which encroaches on city sidewalks/streets. If you wish to remove the vegetation on your property, please do so at your earliest convenience.

NCCMC 8.04.020 8.04.020 -

Nuisances designated.

The city council declares that each and every one (1) of the following conditions constitutes a nuisance, or nuisances, within the meaning and for the purposes of this chapter; and any person, firm, company or corporation creating, causing, committing, maintaining or permitting such nuisances, or

any of them, or their existence or presence, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor punishable as provided in this chapter:

H. Dirt, rubbish, grass, weeds and rank growth on buildings or grounds and adjacent sidewalks or on private property.
