Nevada City is in Stage 3 of our Drought Plan

Given the severity of the State’s water shortage and mandatory conservation requirements for all water suppliers, on April 13, 2022 City Council declared a continued Stage 3 Water Shortage Warning in Nevada City. Declaration of a State 3 Water Shortage Warning is intended to increase awareness of drought challenges and reduce water usage, with the following provisions.

General Provisions

A. All customers will be required to reduce potable water use 20%.

Tips to Conserve Water

Install aerators on bathroom faucets

Install a high-efficiency watersense-labeled toilet

B. All customers shall make conscious efforts to conserve water.

C. All customers shall limit outdoor irrigation of ornamental landscapes

D. Customers shall inspect systems and make a reasonable effort to repair water leaks in toilets, plumbing fixtures and water lines.

E. Outdoor irrigation of ornamental landscapes shall remain on the intended vegetation and not cause runoff to adjacent property, non-irrigated areas, roadways, parking lots, or

structures;

F. Customers shall not use potable water on outdoor landscapes within 48 hours of measurable rainfall (i.e., precipitation having a water content of at least 0.01 inch (0.25 mm)

Police Department Hires CSO-Events Ambassador

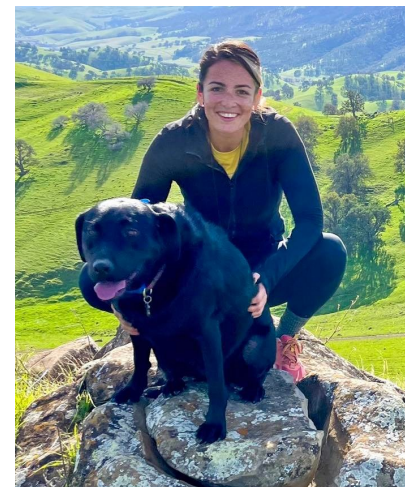
