

Nevada City Swimming Pool Rules

Our employees work hard to prevent injuries and drowning. Below are ways you can help our pool be enjoyable, healthy, and safe for everyone.

- ◆ Children under 8 years of age and those who cannot swim must be accompanied by an adult.
- ◆ Floatation devices must be Coast Guard approved and worn properly.
- ◆ Proper & clean swimming attire must be worn.
- ◆ Use the bathrooms to change clothes - all ages please.
- ◆ Masks, fins, and snorkels may be used with consent of the Lifeguard on Duty. Masks must be plastic, no tempered glass.
- ◆ No glass containers – our bare feet are sensitive to broken glass.
- ◆ The lane lines help all swimmers see where deeper water starts. Do not hang on, swim under, or play on these lines.
- ◆ Patrons must pass a swim test to go into deep water. See the swim test requirement below.
- ◆ Horseplay is not allowed; this includes riding on shoulders, throwing your kids, and dunking your friends.
- ◆ No Running (even on the grass).
- ◆ Alcohol is not allowed in the facility and anyone who is under the influence of alcohol, or any other harmful substances will not be allowed to enter the facility.
- ◆ Smoking is not permitted in Pioneer Park.
- ◆ Keep food and drinks away from the edge of the pool. No one wants to swim in your crumbs.
- ◆ Animals are prohibited in the pool area. (Service animals are allowed in the facility, but not in the pool.)
- ◆ Bicycles, skateboards, scooters, and other vehicles are not permitted inside the pool area.
- ◆ No climbing over the rock walls.
- ◆ No climbing or sitting on the tarps.
- ◆ Look for the “No Diving” signs on deck. Diving in less than 7 feet of water is not allowed.

WE ALSO APPRECIATE...

- ⇒ Customers who shower before entering the pool.
- ⇒ Customers who use the bathroom before swimming and frequently while here.
- ⇒ Customers whose words and actions reflect our family friendly atmosphere.

SWIM TEST REQUIREMENT

Our primary responsibility is to prevent injuries and accidents at the Nevada City Pool. One way to ensure this is to require everyone to take a swim test before entering the deep end of the pool. Speak with a lifeguard about how to take and pass this swim test.

Aquatics staff has final authority in all matters of pool operation, administration, & safety. Thank you for your cooperation.
